A limited number of tickets will be available on the door.

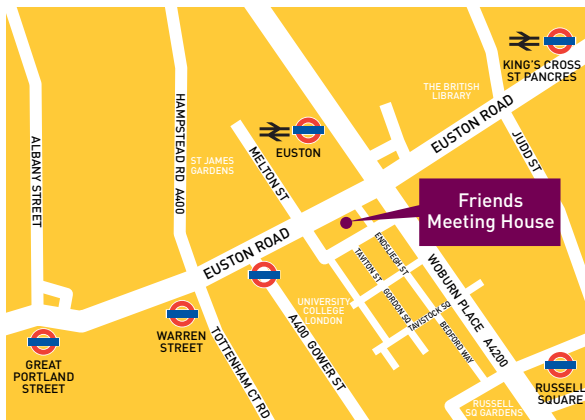

Speaker Biographies



Laurence Banks

Laurence is Deaf and has worked with Go! Sign for over ten years, preaching and teaching both in the UK and abroad, and has just completed a theology degree at the London School of Theology. His seminar will be delivered in BSL with English interpretation.



Jonathan Clark

An approved Social Worker and Church Minister. He currently runs Premier Life, including the confidential helpline - Premier Lifeline. He is a Director of Mind & Soul.



Joni Eareckson Tada

A diving accident in 1967 left Joni Eareckson Tada a quadriplegic in a wheelchair. Today she is a leading disability advocate with the JAF International Disability Center in southern California.



Malcolm Duncan

Malcolm Duncan is the founder and director of 'Church and Community', a charity committed to an inclusive and holistic approach to mission. He is the pastor of two local churches, an author, conference speaker and advisor to the government on issues of faith and identity.



The Rt Revd Dr Michael Langrish

Following ordination, Bishop Michael was a parish priest and school chaplain before becoming Suffragan Bishop of Birkenhead. He has been Diocesan Bishop of Exeter since 2000. He has both national and diocesan responsibilities and is a member of the House of Lords. He is married to Esther, a Counsellor and a Licensed Reader in the Church of England. Their daughter Kathryn has Down's syndrome.



Jonathan Lamb

Jonathan contracted polio at the age of 5, and has lived with a mild disability ever since, mostly impacting his mobility. By God's grace he

has been able to sustain Christian ministry in many parts of the world, both through his work with the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students and now with Langham Partnership International.



Sophia Nicholls

Sophia Nicholls is the co-founder of ASNA: a user-led charity supporting disabled people. With qualifications in physiology and special educational needs, Sophia has been involved in the development of training and awareness programmes. Sophia is the parent of a child who is blind with severe learning and physical disabilities.



Roy McCloughry

Roy McCloughry lectures in Ethics at St John's College Nottingham. He is the author of over a dozen books on contemporary social issues. He is Chairman of Lion Hudson Publishing and Vice-President of Livability. He has lived with epilepsy all his life.



Kay Morgan-Gurr

Kay is joint General Director of Children Worldwide with her husband Steve, and an advisor on disability and accessibility issues. Before this she was a children's nurse working with children who had additional needs of all varieties.



Rev John Naudé

John is a wheelchair user and an ordained Anglican Minister, leading the Church of the Good Shepherd in Waterlooville near Portsmouth. He is also Chair of Churches For All and a Board member of Through the Roof.



Dr Mike Townsend

Dr Mike Townsend is a local church leader, technology consultant, a trustee of both the Royal National Institute of Blind People and the Guide Dogs for the Blind Association and a regular speaker on disability topics. Mike lost his sight at the age of eight.
